2018 Family History Discovery Day Beginning Genealogy and Beyond



Have you ever wondered just who you are related to? Whose descendent you may be? Whose picture that is in the old family album? What your ancestors were actually like? Have you ever wondered how to REALLY find out?



What? Since 1988, the Columbus Georgia Stake of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints has periodically partnered with the Muscogee Genealogical Society to present seminars and workshops on various topics related to genealogy and family history research. For our 30 th anniversary of this event we're back – bigger and better. And it's all FREE!

During the day there will be five 50-minute sessions, with multiple topics being presented in different classrooms throughout the building. Through your pre-registration you will be able to choose the sessions of most interest to you, and you will receive your schedule during the Check-In on the day of the event.

When? Saturday 10 November 2018 (8:45 – 3:30). Check-In is from 8:45 to 9:15 for those that have pre-registered.

- Where? Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, 4400 Reese Road, Columbus, Georgia (North of Macon Road).
- Cost? Registration is free just please attend, since your seat is reserved for you. Lunch will be on your own and sack lunches are welcome. Bottled water will be provided to everyone.
- Who? The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints maintains the largest colle ction of genealogical and family history information in the world. The Family History Library in Salt Lake City is known world wide for its collection of books, microfilm records, and other genealogical information. A branch Family History Center, which can obtain almost anything available at the Salt Lake library, is available right here in Columbus and is open to the public. Founded in 1976, the Muscogee Genealogical Society is a local organization devoted to furthering genealogical research in general, with special emphasis on this area of the country. The Society sponsors 3 to 4 programs a year and publishes a journal, *Muscogiana*, twice a year.
- How? There is limited seating capacity. It is anticipated that pre-registration will fill all available seats. To reserve a seat, the registration slip must be received not later than 3 November 2018. No registrations will be accepted after that date. Be sure to arrive during the Check-In period to receive your personalized class assignments. At 9:15 any unclaimed seats/class assignments will become available for any registrations on the waiting list, and after that for any unregistered walk-ins. Again it is highly recommended that you get your registration in as soon as possible to ensure a seat. We want this to be a good experience for all.

- 16. Latter-day Saint Family History Youth Session Designed specifically for Latter-day Saint youth and their leaders.
- 17. African American Research Specifically oriented to finding family information for those with African-American ancestry.
