Today in Columbus History: On Thursday, May 15, 1884, the following ad appeared in *The Columbus Daily Enquirer-Sun*. It announced a one-night performance at the Springer Opera House of a "powerful society drama" featuring actress Louise Rial (1850 – 1940). Rial, whose acting career began in 1878, when she appeared in "Uncle Tom's Cabin." Rial was active in theater until about 1915, when she began working in silent movies as a supporting actress. She was in "Sin," a 1915 film starring Theda Bara. The magnificent Springer Theatre had opened its doors early in 1871; it had been built by local grocery merchant Francis Joseph Springer, a native of Alsace. Throughout the end of the 19th century and into the early 1900s it featured class acts, including Tom Wiggins (Blind Tom), Edwin Booth, Oscar Wilde, Tom Thumb, Booker T. Washington, John Philip Sousa, Lily Langtry and Franklin D. Roosevelt.
