


Today in Columbus History: On Friday, May 18, 1883, *The Daily Enquirer-Sun* featured a short piece about a wedding reception held at the home of Mrs. Louis Buhler (Minne Stettenheim); her home was probably located on the SE corner of 10th St. and 3rd Ave. (now a vacant lot). Mr. Buhler and his wife were both from Germany; he operated a cigar store in Columbus. Their son Morris later married Sadie Loeb, daughter of Columbus merchant Sol Loeb. It is interesting to note that "The Italian Band" played at the reception – perhaps John Brescia's ancestor and his friends!
