Today in Columbus History: On June 4, 1890, an ad appeared in *The Columbus Enquirer-Sun* for Chancellor and Pearce men's clothing store. They were having a sale on boys' suits. The store was owned by Alexander Clarendon Chancellor, who had opened it in 1873. It had a few different names: Chancellor and Pearce, A.C. Chancellor Co., and, in 1931, it became, simply, Chancellor's. Early on (according to Columbus City directories) the store was located at 1132-1134 Broadway. Around 1913 it moved to its present location at 1108 Broadway. In business for over 145 years in Uptown Columbus, selling quality men's clothing, Chancellors is indeed a Columbus institution!


